

We welcome your participation, but it is not a requirement. To be fair to yourself, please consider attending at least three meetings before you decide whether TCF is right for you.

TO OUR MEMBERS FURTHER DOWN THE "GRIEF ROAD"

Each meeting will have new parents, siblings and grandparents. THINK BACK — what would it have been like for you at your first meeting if there had not been any TCF "veterans" to welcome you, share your grief, encourage you and tell you, "Your pain will not always be this bad." We welcome your presence and support!

INFORMATION REGARDING OUR MEETINGS

This is YOUR group and we are here to support each other. Everyone in the room has walked the path you are on now. We hope you will find our meetings and newsletters to be a comfort and a place where you find hope. The in-person meeting is on the second Tuesday of each month except in December. The virtual meeting is the fourth Thursday of each month except in November when it is the third Thursday (to avoid Thanksgiving) and December when there are no chapter meetings.

In December there are no chapter meetings. The Chapter participates in The Compassionate Friends World Candle Lighting Event on the second Sunday of December.
